Stop sensitivity

How do you stop hot spots or sensitivity around the nose and corner of the eyes and mouth with alpha-hydroxy acid creams?

Areas of the skin that create skin folds can cause an increased concentration of an alphahydroxy cream predisposing to redness and sensitivity. I generally recommend avoiding application of creams to areas such as the corners of the mouth and nose. Patients who are sensitive to alpha-hydroxy acid creams around the eyes should decrease their usage to alternate days to improve tolerability. Individuals who continue to experience sensitivity and redness should consider using alternative, non-prescription, anti-aging eye creams containing ingredients such as retinol, niacinamide or copper.

Post-wax breakouts

Help! My client's skin breaks out after I wax her upper lip. What should I do?

Most breakouts following a wax are due to follicular irritation. You should recommend a mild topical steroid such as hydrocortisone and benzoyl peroxide cream. If the condition persists, refer her to a dermatologist for treatment.
